I had in mind the concerto piano scores which are used in settings where a full orchestra is not available or practical for one reason or another. I think if a series of concertos written for small ensembles existed, it would be a good way to bring exciting music to people in places where a symphony orchestra is never seen or heard. The Concerto is in three movements: Allegro with a tonal center of D dorian, Largo centered in A aeolian, and Moderato centering on D lydian, A major, and F# minor.

Concierto de Chiaro - Guitar Concerto for John De Chiaro Apr 12 2022 This concerto was composed for my good friend Giovanni De Chiaro, and was commissioned by the Shreveport Summer Music Festival, where it premiered. The title "Concierto de Chiaro" is one with multiple meanings and combines words of Spanish and Italian origins. First, of course, it is a homage to John's name, but chiaro also means light in Italian, and indeed the work has a certain feeling of light and lightness to it, as one would experience on a walk through a forest on a sunny day. There is a hint of Spanish style within the music as well, which is my way of reflecting the great connection between Spanish culture and the history of the guitar. The piece has been performed with numerous orchestras, and John and I recorded it with the London Symphony Orchestra in January of 2017 for the Centaur label.

Concerto for the Left Hand Mar 11 2022 A journey into the mind of concert pianist Paul Wittgenstein, whose right arm was amputated during WWI. Inspired by the biography of Austrian concert pianist Paul Wittgenstein, Concerto takes readers

through a dreamlike and poetic universe deep into the mind of the tortured, melancholy, complex man upon whom only music seems to have a calming effect. Wounded during the First World War, Paul Wittgenstein had his right arm amputated but nevertheless pursued his dream to be a successful concert pianist. The fortune his father left him allowed Wittgenstein to commission works playable with only the left hand from the greatest composers of the day—which is how the legendary pianist Maurice Ravel, at Wittgenstein's request, came to compose his famous Concerto for the Left Hand.

Concerto for Guitar Aug 24 2020 You've probably heard Elmer Bernstein's music, you just don't realize it: The Academy Award-winning composer has scored more than 200 films, including *The Magnificent Seven*, *To Kill a Mockingbird*, and *The Ten Commandments*. In fact, it was Bernstein who encouraged Christopher Parkening to study music back in the 1960s. Now Bernstein's written a big, romantic concerto for the guitarist. Lushly orchestrated (by Bernstein's colleague Christopher Palmer) and unfailingly melodic, this is a major addition to the instrument's repertory. The bold, cinematic character of the music is evident from the beginning, and this is what gives the concerto its evocative atmosphere. The composer conducts the London Symphony, and he also guides the orchestra in Jack Marshall's imaginative arrangement of Isaac Albiz's *La Vega*. It's an ideal coupling. Marshall transforms the piano original into a magical, miniature guitar concerto that conjures up vivid images of Spain's castles and villages. Marshall's *Essay for Guitar* is offered as a substantial encore. This delightful, dulcet concertino was actually Parkening's debut recording, made back in 1967 when the guitarist was just 19, and it wears its years lightly. Reissuing this little bit of history gives us an ear-opening glimpse of Parkening's amazing precocity; presented alongside these two stunning new performances, it also allows us to hear how richly his gifts have matured.

Composing a Concerto for Two Cellos Jan 29 2021 *Composing a Concerto for Two Cellos: Pulling the threads together for 'Warp and Weft'* Colin Riley provides us with an interesting and at times intensely personal insight into the journey behind composing 'Warp and Weft', his *Concerto for Two Cellos, Strings and Percussion*. Taken originally from blog entries, the book charts the creative processes and day-to-day administrative struggles of a contemporary composer. Writing in an engaging, inviting style, Riley describes his early attachment to the cello, including at Chetham's School of Music in Manchester and at the University of York, and touches on his approach and philosophy as a Senior Lecturer teaching at Brunel University and elsewhere. His two creative retreats to Aldeburgh, centrally important to the creative process behind not just the *Concerto* but also other pieces composed during

the same period, are vividly and honestly described. Composing a Concerto for Two Cellos is easy reading and is a fascinating insight into how Riley's music comes to fruition and how a composer really works in today's world. Colin Riley's work draws on a range of elements including new technologies, improvisation, song-writing and large-scale classical form. As an established but ever-questioning figure within the contemporary music scene he cuts an independent path and his work is hard to categorise, embodying a genuine integration of stylistic approaches. He is a Senior Lecturer at Brunel University and writes a regular blog about composing called 'Riley Notes' [www.colinriley.co.uk].

Concertos Jun 14 2022 Mozart's supremacy as a composer is nowhere more apparent than in his piano concertos, which were a lifelong preoccupation for him from 1767, when he was 11 years old, until 1791, the year of his death. The remarkably precocious works in this volume, written in 1776 and 1777, foreshadow the even greater piano concertos to come. Each exhibits the qualities for which their successors are justly celebrated: keyboard mastery, experimentation with texture, and a natural sensitivity to form and balance. Despite his youth, Mozart captured the spirit of his times with these compositions, reflecting an eighteenth-century mood of elegance and refinement. This volume includes the Triple Concerto No. 7 in F (K.242), Mozart's only concerto for three pianos, with the composer's cadenzas for all three movements. Also here are the Concerto No. 8 in C (K.246) and Concerto No. 9 in E-flat (K.271), offering a contrast in moods – the former, in the lighthearted, refined galant spirit; the latter, a work of dramatic, emotional character. The concluding music in this prized compilation is the world-famous Double Concerto No. 10 in E-flat (K.365), written for the composer himself and his sister Nannerl. Pianists and all lovers of fine music will welcome this valuable compilation of seminal works, reproduced complete and unabridged from the authoritative Breitkopf & Hrtel Complete Works edition. Included as well, as appendixes, are Mozart's original cadenzas for Concerto No. 9 and reproductions of the rare autograph sketches of cadenzas for the Double Concerto.
